

I have heard it said, "I am spiritual, but not religious." What does it mean to be a spiritual person? According to "Strength of the Journey," Spirituality is how we are in relationship to God, to other people, to the world around us, and to ourselves. Spirituality is the process of staying engaged in these relationships, the intention we bring to them, and how willing

we are to evolve as the relationship affects us."

Over the years I have tried many different spiritual practices, including: praying with icons, dwelling in the word, stretch and pray, and centering prayer. A centering prayer is a "modern version of an ancient practice that invites us to place ourselves in God's presence and remain there for a period of time, patiently letting go of our own thoughts as they emerge."

To begin a centering prayer, select a sacred phrase or image on which to focus your mind and a location that allows you to sit comfortably and quietly. Close your eyes if it feels comfortable. Sit with straight back and hands resting open in your lap. Mentally or verbally, begin to repeat your phrase or focus on your image. Start by doing this for one minute.

Running and biking have become sort of spiritual exercises for me as I feel connected to the earth, let go of my thoughts, and at times just focus on my breathing and putting one foot in front of another on a run. Not everyone is a runner, but if you are able, you might consider walking as a spiritual exercise.

Walking is a spiritual practice that "yields so many dividends: replenishment of the soul, connection with the natural world, problem-solving, self-esteem, health and healing, and heightened attention. Movement seems to encourage dialogue, leading to richer conversations with soul mates, friends, and even strangers. Artists report that walking activates the imagination and opens up the creative process."

With walking there are the routines of walking the dog, taking a break, walking around the block, or communing with God at the end of the day. These rituals of everyday spirituality can lift spirits and provide peace and contentment in our stressful times.

Continue to find ways that you can connect to God and each other, whether that is a spiritual exercise or something else. I am more than happy to share more about spiritual exercises with you at any time.

Stewardship

God, I'm Joyful And Mary said,

"My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name." -Luke 1:46-49

In a novel, Dinner at Homesick Restaurant, Anne Tyler tells a story about an unhappy woman name Pearl. Now blind and near the end of her life, she asks her son Ezra to read aloud the entries from her childhood diaries. He assumed she simply enjoyed reminiscing about her past. But one day...

"Early this morning," he read to his mother, "I went out behind the house to weed. Was kneeling in the dirt by the stable with my pinafore a mess and the perspiration rolling down my back, wiped my face on my sleeve, reached for the trowel, and all at once thought, Why I believe that at just this moment I am absolutely happy."

That was the end of the entry. He fell silent. "Thank you, Ezra." his mother said. "There's no need to read anymore."

Many of us can recall ecstatic times in our lives - moments of falling in love, of finding one's true vocation in life, of extraordinary prayer experiences, of tremendous success, and of feeling loved and accepted. But as the months and years go on, you experience darker times. In those times people sometimes mistakenly perceive their entire lives as dark and unhappy. When trying to remember joyful moments they dismiss them as delusional and unreal.

Saint Ignatius Loyola, advised that when in consolation one should prepare for desolation. He was not being morbid and was not advising that one spoil a joyful moment by reminding themselves that there are more troubles to come. Instead, he said this because he knew from experience that doubt and cynicism might set in all too soon. How, then, do we use joy to prepare for desolation? The most important way is to be as faithful to prayer during the joyful times of life as when we find ourselves in trouble. This may be difficult to do; I tend to turn to God more often during times of distress than during happy times. But to prepare for desolation, I should take my joy to prayer. I should praise God for it and ask God to show me ways that I might use this joy to build a culture of generosity at St. Stephen the Martyr.




Christian Education

Human Concerns

The food pantry needs in the Milwaukee area continue to be great. Our food pantry partners appreciate the generosity of SSM. The need is especially great for items that provide protein such as peanut butter and canned meats such as chicken or tuna. There is also a need for non-food items such as tooth paste and brushes, bar soap, shampoo, conditioner, lotion, toilet paper, paper towels, dish soap and laundry soap. These are items that one cannot buy with food assistance and are difficult to squeeze out of tight budgets.

Items can be placed in the bin in the church narthex or if preferred, cash donations can be made - just mark your contribution "food pantries".

On August 19th, Human Concerns helped with Tippecanoe's Friday bagged lunch program. We provided 20 lunches that included two meat and cheese sandwiches, fruit, chips, dessert, breakfast bar and bottled water and were handed out at Christ Church UCC. Twenty bag lunches will be provided again on

Organ Recital and Dedication Sunday, October 9, 2022 at 4:00PM

The congregation and community are invited to attend this performance on the newly installed Casavant Frères pipe organ.



The twenty-three rank instrument, Casavant Frères Ltée.

Opus 3324, was originally installed in Norwood Park Lutheran Church in Chicago in 1976. After that parish closed in 2018, the instrument was moved to St. Stephen the Martyr Lutheran Church in Greendale by Ericksen, Christian & Associates, Chicago area organbuilders. Significant work was done on the instrument, including a new façade, voicing changes for the new room, and updated electronic control systems.

The recitalist will be Andrew Schaeffer, Director of Music and Organist at Luther Memorial Church in Madison. A native of Chicago, Mr. Schaeffer was a member of Norwood Park Lutheran Church and spent many hours with this instrument in its original location as a beginning student organist. He holds degrees from St. Olaf College and Yale University and is a Doctor of Musical Arts candidate in organ at the University of Oklahoma. Schaeffer also



serves as the Editor-at-Large of The Diapason, one of the oldest and largest American journals devoted to organ, harpsichord, and church music.
