

Dear SSM Faith Family,

Fall is my favorite time to run or bike outdoors. I appreciate the cooler air in my lungs and the beautiful changing landscape.

In September I completed Ironman 70.3 in Madison. In preparation, I set out for long early runs or rides on Saturday morn-

ings. After a morning of exercise there has been an occasional ache or pain here or there, and sometimes at the end of the race I have told myself to: **Press On.** 

Our brother Paul knew something about pressing on in life as he writes in Philippians 3: 13-14, "...forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus."

Life poses many challenges and there are many ups and downs along life's journeys. We may wonder if anything good can come from our life challenges, our sufferings, our brokenness. Yet St. Paul gives us advice: **Press on**. Paul admits that he would have every reason to be boastful. He had been what we would call a religious zealot. But he considers it all as loss compared to the joy of knowing Christ, even amid his sufferings.

Paul is able to see life in perspective. He knows he hasn't yet arrived. He hasn't reached the resurrection. But he presses it on. For him what is most important is forgetting the past and straining forward to what lies ahead. He presses on knowing that God's promise stands.

Through our hardships, our suffering, our pain we hold onto the past and look to the future, rejoicing in God's forgiveness and second chances. God's love and mercy is stretching us outward and onward.

We press on, knowing that even from broken and crushed grapes comes wine. Wine that is the cup of salvation. Wine that makes life's bitterness a bit sweeter. Even from our brokenness will come gifts we can't even imagine. So we press on. Filled with gratitude and hope, we press on.

Perhaps some of you recognize the T-shirt. I'm sure that some of you have several in different colors and have warn them frequently. I've seen them around Milwaukee on city streets, in stores, in parks and all over. My first thought, "Hey! There's a Lutheran." The theme and content of the shirt is what is striking. I know when I'm wearing the shirt people comment on liking it.

Generosity is an attitude that comes from two things. First is gratitude. I have taken to beginning the day with the list of

things for which I am truly grateful. I find that it shapes my day. It keeps me focused upon the greatness of life but also the fact that it's much easier to take for granted where I am and what I have in my life, and sometimes leaves too much room to think about the things I don't have in my life. We all know where that can lead.

The truth is that I am where I am and have what I have because of God's goodness and the people around me. It helps to give thanks because it leads us to recognize that there is a giver of all things. I know it seem like we have what we have "because we worked hard for it." Yet COVID has proven to us all how quickly that can change, and in matters of life and death, I believe we there recognize that there is a power greater than ourselves behind life.

The second factor behind the attitude is thought and concern for those around us. It can come in so many ways – a can of soup or jar of peanut butter brought to a food bank; sitting for hours sewing together pieces of fabric for a quilt or a school bag destined for others who need them; a phone call to someone who's sick or lonely; a visit to a shut-in member with communion; or a bag full of school supplies to fill school bags. All of these are bred in a culture that seeks to reach the lives of God's children in need and these are bred in a culture of love given generously.

These are the signs of the Culture of Generosity. It's here at St. Stephen the Martyr and its one of the things that drew Bonnie and me here and one of the things that I give thanks for every day. Let me say Thank You for the gift of belonging to such and place. We of the Stewardship Committee wish to say thank you for the generosity that lives here in you. I look forward to continuing to grow in such a culture as I hope you also take delight in the joys of sharing God's love.


# **Blessing of the Animals**

## **Loose Ends Lunch**



## 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Meru Partnership Celebration –

25 years ago a young pastor (now Bishop Elias Kitoi) from the newly formed Diocese of Meru was attending Wartburg Seminary in Iowa. He asked a fellow pastor, Ed Weiskotten from the Greater Milwaukee Synod, if he knew of any US synods that might be interested in forming a partnership with Meru. A partnership was born and we are blessed to learn and grow from our partners in Christ.

On Saturday, Sept. 10, via Zoom, a celebration was held that included all former bishops from both the Greater Milwaukee





Synod and the Diocese of Meru as well as our current bishops. Prayer petitions were written and said by leaders from the various ministries we share. The Monday Monthly Study also began in September. Join them on the first Monday of each month at 1:00pm around the fireplace. For more information contact the church office.






