

Greater Milwaukee Synodical Women's Organization

The Annual Convention/Gathering of Women, was held on Saturday, October 8th. The number of attendees, included 7 Board Members, 8 church representatives and 6 other women for a total of 21. Though the attendance was small there was lively discussion of the only topic on the agenda, "would this organization have to fold because of lack of response for a leadership position in this organization of women or would the SWO survive." Many in attendance didn't want to see the SWO disband. There was only 1 person interested in a leadership position at the meeting, Donna Yourell for President. Donna was unanimously voted and sworn in as the President, which is a 2 year term. If you are interesting in more information about the SWO please

Women ELCA

At the gathering, we had a very interesting presentation from

the Street Angels representative, Eva. This group of volunteers was founded in 2016 and is based at Ascension Lutheran Church on South 27th Street. The Street Angels is a mobile outreach program that assists our neighbors without homes in Milwaukee County. They travel throughout the county three nights per week, making 50-60 stops with its 2 outreach buses, 156 nights per year, providing hot meals, bag lunches, drinking water, hygiene items, clothing, blankets, tents and HOPE to those who are experiencing street homelessness. Their impact since 2018 has seen 1,500 unique individuals experiencing homelessness. Through the support of basic needs, 411 individuals have been connected to resources resulting in permanent housing. Over 55,000 meals have been served! Street Angels has 3 full-time and 2 part-time staff and are always looking for more volunteer help. Music and Worship




On November 5th and 6th, we will commemorate All Saints Day, where we will light candles in memory of the saints who have come before us.
