

- Meet Mt Meru Coffee Farmer Sara Pallangyo - Sara joined the Women Farmers Initiative organized at the Makumira Processing Center of the Mt. Meru Specialty Coffee Growers Association. Her farm con-

sists of only one acre at 4,460 ft. elevation up Mt. Meru. Providing for her six children and grandchildren is driving Sara's hard work on the coffee farm, and she is relying on better providing for her family through her fair-trade proceeds, higher than the market rate. The training provided by the Project and Association prepared her, she believes, for better crops and a



Seeds and gardening tools


Mosquito nets for a family

Meeting Called to order at 6:30pm by Jason Covert Community Mapping led by Pastor Hooper January Minutes approved as corrected.

Financial Report

- J Miller's written report shows some fluctuation in giving in this first of the year, nevertheless the congregation is moving forward.
- J. Muroni's written report showed that we received more than we spent in this first month.

Financial reports were approved.

Pastor's Time

Another delivery of Narcan was received from the Greendale Health Dept. Four kids are signed up for Lutherdale Bible Camp, subsidy will be available as needed.

Human Concerns – The committee has chosen the recipients of the special envelop giving this year. The feeding offered by Divine Intervention was successful. They had to reduce the number of people served to 10 people. We will participate in the event again March 12. Lutheran Disaster Relief will receive 100% of the Ash Wednesday offering.

Christian Ed – We will be using old VBS materials as the current children will not have participated when the materials were last used. Sunday School's last Sunday will be June 4th.
