
### Sunday, January 28, 2024

### Christian Education

Christian Education is alive and well at St. Stephen the Martyr. We are looking forward to an active and interesting 2024.

**Men's Bible Study** is reading and studying through the book of Revelation every first and third Wednesday of the month at 9:30am.

Women's Bible Study is studying Luther's Small Catechism and is about to start looking at the Apostles Creed. They meet at 10:30am on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month.

Both of these groups meet in person in the Fellowship Hall and over zoom. If you would like to join either group - any time is a good time to join - you can just show up or contact the office for zoom information.

**The Monthly Monday Group** is a small group that meets the first Monday of each month at 1:00pm. They meet in the Narthex around the fireplace. This is a self run group with participants usually taking turns leading the discussion. Materials are provided.

**Sunday School** is active. There are usually more than 20 kiddos in attendance, divided into three grade levels: 4K & 5K, grades 1, 2 & 3 and grades 4, 5 &6. Lessons utilize the same Bible readings that are used in the church services, so the students are learning about the same things that the adults are in

church. Everyone comes home with more about the stories and at least one activity that was completed during the class. Sunday School begins in the 9:30am Sunday church service and after the Children's Message students go to their grade level classes. There is no need to register, if you have or know of children who fall within these grade levels and you would like them to attend Sunday School, just bring them any Sunday morning.

**Confirmation Class** for our 7th and 8th graders continues twice a month on Thursday evenings as participants prepare for their Confirmation. Pastor Brian can be contacted for more information about Confirmation Class.

### Council Minutes, Dec. 12, 2024

Present: Pastor Brian Hooper; Jane Miller; Kipp Zimmermann; John Muroni; Denise Sanders; Eric Sanders; Lorin Schuchardt; Bonnie Zimmermann; Shelly Rosenstock; Sandy Wesolowski; Jeremy Hanna.

Called to order at 6:30pm by Denise Sanders. Denise read a short devotion. Minutes were approved as corrected.



#### Financial

- J. Miller: Giving is on schedule for this time of year. Because of a special donation, the building fund is up.
- J. Muroni: The balances in accounts are positive. Finical report was approved.

#### Pastor's Time

In January there will be a pulpit swap. Josh Simon from Emmanuel UCC will preach.

New Comers orientation was completed. Three families, some with children, will be joining.

Wild Church will host an outdoor winter solstice worship in Franklin.

There will be Christmas Caroling in December.

Pastor will take the week after Christmas off.



Carpet replacement will proceed in the new year using the insurance claim money. Bids are in. We have 180 days to submit to the insurance. We need to make a down payment and place the order to meet insurance requirements.

A large donation made earlier in the year was designated mostly to the roof repair project, with \$7500 remaining to be designated by council for current needs. Council discussed options and approved a \$2000 contribution to food pantries, \$500 for a special Unity request, with the remaining set aside for the possible sound system project.

CD options: The twelve-month CD is coming due soon. Our best option is to reinvest the sum at 5% for 12 months. Our total deposit at Old National will be over the FDIC insurance amount so John M. will look into making deposits at other institutions to cover our accounts.

### Council Minutes Continued

Special Offerings: A request was made by a congregant to change the current designation percentage of special offerings. Council reviewed and agreed to maintain the current designation of 60% of special offerings for Human Concerns selections.

#### **Annual Meeting**

Mission Endowment Fund: A Proposal was made to offer an amendment to the administration of the MEF. The new proposal is that the funds be managed by the treasurer in conjunction with the church council. The amendment requires 2/3 majority in the congregation vote. Council approved submitting the proposal to the congregation for discussion at the annual meeting.

Sound System: There will be a proposal to upgrade our sound system to the annual voter's meeting. The proposal was approved to be placed before the voters.

RIC: The committee has been working on a welcome statement and will provide an update on their work at the annual meeting.

#### Budget

The council worked on the budget. At the present there is a deficit that they are still working to reduce. There will be continued discussion.

December Newsletter articles are due December 15. Annual reports are due now.

Meeting adjourned at 8:52pm.
