




Pastor's Page

SSM Youth Mardí Gras Celebration



Mardi Gras refers to events of the Carnival celebration, beginning on or after the Christian feasts of the Epiphany (Three Kings Day) and culminating on the day before Ash Wednesday, which is known as Shrove Tuesday. *Mardi Gras* is French for "Fat Tuesday", reflecting the practice of the last night of eating rich, fatty foods before the ritual Lenten

sacrifices and fasting of the Lenten season.

While not observed nationally throughout the United States, a number of historically ethnically French cities and regions in the country have notable celebrations. Mardi Gras arrived in North America in the late 17th century, when King Louis XIV sent people defend France's claim on the territory of *Louisiane*, which included what are now the U.S. states of Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana and part of eastern Texas.

Even though we are in Milwaukee, Wisconsin we are going to be treated to a Mardi Gras celebration this year on Saturday, February 3rd at 5:45pm, and on Sunday, February 4th at 10:45am, each following worship. The celebration is sponsored by our youth. This will be a fund raiser to help them pay for their trip to the youth event this summer. Watch for more details to come soon.

We continue with the season of Epiphany, ending with Transfiguration Sunday on February 11.




Lent starts February 14 with Ash Wednesday services at 11AM and 6:30PM.


The 2024 Martin Luther King, Jr. Contest submission deadline is January 31st.



Carpet Replacement Information

We are getting new carpeting throughout the building. A few months ago, the church experienced a leak in our fire suppression system, which resulted in some staining of our carpet, damage covered by our insurance. The current carpet is 12 years old and the average life expectancy of carpeting is 5-15 years, though ours does not receive daily wear. The council decided that replacing now would provide the church an opportunity to replace the aging



carpeting with something new at no cost and increase the time before another replacement is needed. The replacement will occur sometime this spring and while the style will be comparable to what we have now, the color will be different (our options were limited). 
