Dear Family of Faith,

Happy Easter! Or I might say, "Have a wonderful Easter celebration!" I write this as some of you will receive this newsletter before and after Easter. Our celebration of Easter will continue in April as we celebrate Jesus' victory over sin and death.

Our Easter gospel lesson this year is from Mark 16: 1-8. It is interesting to note that in this resurrection account, there is no appearance of the resurrected Jesus' body. As



we think about Jesus' death and resurrection, some may ask, "Where is the body?" That is an interesting question... What if we could go back to the first century and not find Jesus' body after his death? Does it mean he had risen and ascended? Or does it raise other questions?

Easter is remembering and participating in Jesus' death and resurrection.

Easter is renewing our vows to live our baptism in the world.

Easter is the world coming back to life in the yearly miracle of spring.

Easter is about God's love.

Yet it is more. Easter is about the body, and not the one two thousand years ago. As one hymn puts it: *A new creation comes to life and grows as Christ's new body takes on flesh and blood.*

We are an Easter people, the body of Christ in the world, and our celebration rolls on for fifty days, and with it a continual reminder of the awesome power of God's work through Christ.

Easter happens among us each week as we celebrate holy communion and are fed and nourished for service in the world. The resurrection is present tense as we gather around the baptismal waters that cleanse and renew us and all who are part of the mystery of the Easter body.






Human Concerns

Council Minutes, February 13, 2024

Meeting called to order at 6:32pm by D. Sanders. - J. Miller lead the devotion. Minutes were approved as corrected.

Financial Report:

The number of pledges is up. The difference between pledged amounts and actual receipts were close. The building fund exceeded expectation because of the special donation made during the year. The reserve accounts are doing well in interest earned. The reserve fund is at \$130,000. We have reserve funds for continuing education in savings account, and a separate savings account to endowment. Benevolence was \$52,000 this year amounted to over 10%.

Financial Reports were approved.

<u>Pastors Time:</u> We received new families with children. We will be honoring Black History Month in February. The pulpit swap with Josh Simon was well received. Pastor is celebrating 20 years of ordination.

Current Actions:

The carpet payment was made the carpet selected and awaiting the date for installation.

The method of voting at the annual meeting will again be unanimous consent.

The Budget was approved for presentation to the voters.

RIC has completed a statement of welcome for discussion and will follow up with a survey to the congregation.

Committee Concerns:

<u>Christian Ed</u>: We've had a good response in Sunday School. Men's and Women's bible studies are proceeding as well as the Monday monthly Bible Study. Confirmation is proceeding. VBS is looking for someone to take charge and lead the development.

<u>Human Concerns</u>: We are signed up for Divine Intervention meal. We're continuing to collect coats, socks and underwear for those who are homeless.

Music and Worship: Lenten midweek worship will be at 6:30 and will be Holden Prayer, with the exception of Ash Wednesday which will be at 1:00 pm and 6:30 pm with communion.

Youth and family: Planning an Easter Egg Hunt.

Fellowship: is planning for Easter Breakfast much like we did it last year.

Finance: The plan is to count every other week in the coming year.

Adjourned at 7:25pm
