

Crayons – 24 count




#### **Meru Partnership Live Auction Events**

I received a WhatsApp message from our partner pastor on May 16 sharing news of the recent flooding in the area. (Yes, the same area that has been experiencing drought the past 2 years). Pastor Nnko writes "Shalom dear

Julie, we thank God very much, we are doing well. Although all the farms of the church and 'members' have been surrounded by water. And the crops 'burned' (?) because of the water. The rains have destroyed the fields, roads, there are about twenty families whose houses are in the water...no one has died. The Canaan areas we had to close the school so that the children don't get wet. I am sending pictures of water and road."



"On Sunday, we succeeded in organizing the Mbaaseny building fund raising. We thank God very much for the level contributed. The work will start, we are waiting for the water to decrease a little."

## The Season After Pentecost

The Season after Pentecost begins the day after Pentecost and ends the day before the First Weekend of Advent. It may include twenty—three to twenty—eight weekends, depending on the date of Easter, but the first weekend is always Trinity Weekend, and the last is always the Weekend of Christ the King. The season also includes All Saints. In 2024 there will be twenty-six weekends in the season. The color for the season, except for the special weekends noted above, is green. This time used to be called Ordinary Time, not because it is ordinary but because the weekends are numbered as in "ordinal".





Meeting called to order at 6:39pm by D. Sanders. J. Muroni led the devotion. Minutes approved as corrected.

**Financial Report** - J. Miller – We show \$18000 ahead in the general fund because of the donations that were made for the entire year. The fundraisers did well. - J. Muroni – The contract for the parking lot that was made last year is in force. The Mission Investment fund will be closed out to pay for the parking lot. The carpet will come out of the reserve and will be reimbursed by the money received from the insurance. - Financial Reports approved.

**Pastor's Time** - The Greendale Community Church attended Maundy Thursday worship at SSM. The Unclober book discussion on Sunday and Thursday went well. We will be replacing the camera used for smaller zoom meetings with an OWL that will allow a camera to focus upon the speaker. There will be a railing placed on the walkway of the prayer garden to make it more accessible. Pastor Brian has shifted his schedule from Mondays off to Fridays off. Pastor is looking for feedback on the Prayer Garden outdoor worship. Easter Breakfast raised \$396 for the National Youth Gathering. The youth are planning a Cinco de Mayo feast to raise money for their trip, July 16–20 in New Orleans.

Current Action - Planning for congregation meeting for the election of council. RIC has completed a draft of the Welcome Statement. The congregation will need to approve it. Council will review and recommend the final product. The Congregation meeting is scheduled for June 2. The memorial committee is in discussion about a new church sign for out on the road. Sound System installation will begin on Thursday. The process could be about two weeks and will be done in three sections. First the sanctuary audio, then video, then the fellowship hall. The Synod Assembly is in May and we still need a volunteer to attend.
