

Dear SSM Faith Family,

Thank you again for helping get our youth to New Orleans for the 2024Youth Gathering. Thanks for supporting the fundraisers, praying for our youth and making the trip possible. I truly believe that events like this are life changing and faith forming.



We gathered with 16,000 youth from around the country centering around the theme: Created to Be. On day 1, participants explored the theme Created to Be: BRAVE, remembering that we are created to show up with an open mind and heart, willing to be challenged. Day 2, Created to be: Authentic, reminded participants to bring their whole selves and know that they are loved by our Creator. Day 3, Created to be Free, spoke to the freedom we all experience when we truly live into who God created us to be. Day 4: Created to be: Disruptive, reminded attendees that they are created to be disruptive, to work for justice for all our siblings.

Powerful speakers, music and projects centered around these themes. We gathered each evening for the Mass Gathering in the Smoothie King Center, and of course we enjoyed some smoothies. Our accompaniment project involved meeting with community organizers and learning about the impact of Hurricane Katrina, and challenges today. The youth went out into the community with garbage bags and shovels. Our project was to clear the storm drains so that water could flow when there is flooding or heavy rain. We found that it does indeed rain a lot in New Orleans.

While in New Orleans we also had the opportunity to visit the National World War II Museum. This visit was one of the highlights for the youth. We also had some wonderful food including jambalaya, gumbo, and Shrimp Po'boys. We made a stop at the famous Café DuMond and had some scrumptious beignets. As I write this, last Sunday we heard in the Gospel the last chapter of John the Baptist's life (Mark 6). It was surrounded by the call and commissioning of disciples. John assumed at great cost his place in the coming of the kingdom of God. His birth was another miracle of God's plan. He was sent into the womb of Elisabeth and Zachariah who were both advanced in years. His job was to prepare the way and announce the coming Messiah. He was to many eyes a stranger and a radical in the desert dressed in cammel hair and eating locust and wild honey and preaching of repentance and God's forgiveness and offering the traditional washing in water for cleansing. As we come to see in Mark, the

world was not ready to receive the Baptist or eventually the Messiah himself. Why you may ask? I'm glad you asked me that question. John's and Jesus' message were not the ones that the writings the Torah prescribed. There were no sacrifices involved. There were no priests consulted. There was only faith needed to come before God with repentant hearts. This was the message that John and the disciples were given to preach to the world. These who were called to a task said yes. They invested their lives in the work that God had given them to do. They recognized that their lives consisted of their place in the world. We who have journeyed into the water with Jesus and John have been about being sent every bit as much as they. How might God use me to live out my place in the world? What do I have to offer in the work of God to reform the world into God's image? These are questions of the steward. You are invited to ask God the question, what gift may I use to invest in the work of your kingdom?

Sound System Project and Fundraising



We hope that you are enjoying the new sound system. The project included upgrades and improvements to the sanctuary and fellowship hall, as well as updates to the narthex/gathering space. At the annual meeting in January, when the congregation approved the project, it was also approved to fund the project with a loan of \$37,000 (60% of the total project cost) from our current funds. We have now begun a three-year repayment plan to return the

funds to the original accounts. If you are so moved and able, please consider contributing to the sound system fund. Thank you for your consideration.
