on Sunday, September 22nd. Material and instructions for sewing the school bags are available at the school bag display.


Our goal is to fill 200 school bags. Items still needed are:

Rulers with centimeters on one side and inches on the other Pencil sharpeners


Black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink) – (<u>five needed in each bag</u>)

Sound System Update

By now, you've likely experienced the incredible difference our updated sound system has made in our services. This state-of-the-art system, which cost \$56,000, has been fully paid for, thanks to a thoughtful financial plan that combined using our some of our capital reserves along with \$16,000 in generous donations specifically for the sound system.

We deliberately chose this approach instead of taking out a loan, a decision that will save SSM over \$4,000 in interest. This prudent management of our resources ensures that we remain financially sound while enhancing the worship experience for everyone in our congregation.

As we move forward, we are making 36 monthly installments from our general fund to replenish the capital reserves. We kindly ask that you consider making a donation to help expedite this process. Donations can be made by using the church envelopes or via the Vanco app. Your contributions will go a long way in ensuring that our church remains financially healthy and prepared for future needs.



The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Denise Sanders.

Kristy Knipple shared a devotion.

May 14 council meeting minutes were approved.

Pastor's Report/Time: Shirley Rau funeral 5/15. Lisa and Kevin Neutgens (nonmember) wedding 6/1. GMS Assembly 5/17-5/18. Concluded confirmation classes 5/16. Pastor connected with synod DEM. He will be coaching a synod congregation beginning the end of June. In the June newsletter information on Wild Church is shared. There is a special meeting on June 24th at 6:30pm with Pastor Larry Harpster to talk more about Wild Church and help us plan our Wild Church Worship. Pastor Brian has also been exploring "Fresh Expressions".

Financial Reports: Jane Miller reviewed the financial report noting that we are ahead of projections because some members have paid their pledge in full for the year. Funding the sound system was discussed. John Muroni reminded the council at the annual meeting in January, we agreed to borrow from ourselves. He is now suggesting a repayment plan. After discussion, a motion for a three (3) year self-funded loan with monthly payments of \$1000 (plus extras when possible) was agreed upon. The motion was passed as amended.. Financial reports approved.

Current Action/Discussed Items

Church and Synod Constitution review -SSM constitution has not been updated since 2004. Some required provisions in the synod constitution are different from the SSM constitution. The council reviewed chapters 5 and 6 to determine differences. Other chapters will be reviewed as time allows.

Council Installation scheduled for Sunday, June 14.

Alex Dollar reminded everyone of the youth and family ice cream social on 6/20 after the Thursday outdoor service.

A property chair is still needed.

SSM does not have a sabbatical policy. C. Jackett has volunteered to head up a committee to draft one.

Human Concerns raised about \$1200 at the auction on Saturday and Sunday, June 8th and 9th.

July Council meeting is cancelled. Next council meeting is August 13th. No Mega meeting for July.
