Pastor's Page

Dear SSM Community and Friends,

In March, we begin the church season of Lent. Lent is the period of 40 days that precedes Easter, and has its origins in the early days of the Church. Converts seeking to become Christian spent several

years in study and preparation. Then they went through a final period of purification and enlightenment for the 40 days before their baptism at Easter. The rest of the church began to observe this season of Lent in solidarity with these newest Christians. It became an opportunity to recall and renew the commitment of their own baptism.

Today we consider Lent to be a time of reflection. On Ash Wednesday we hear this invitation:

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil, and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and Neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the disciple of Lent-self examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love-strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. Let us continue our journey through these 40 days to the great Three Days of Jesus death and resurrection. -ELW

Some people might fast or give something up for Lent. Perhaps instead of giving up something for Lent this year, we can strive to be more intentional about taking on some new spiritual practices during these 40 days that may turn us back toward God and be more present to the gifts of God that surround us.

- Go for a walk and give thanks for the gifts of creation you notice along the way.
- Try a new food that's healthier for you or the environment.
- Fast from complaining or gossiping
- Write a letter to someone you love and tell them why.
- Give money and/or volunteer with an agency that helps the poor.
- Pray for your enemies. Don't have enemies? Pray for someone who annoys you.
- Commit to regular worship attendance, especially during Holy Week.
- Tell someone else why your faith is important to you.

During Lent there will be midweek worship services on Wednesdays at 6:30pm. We will sing the familiar *Holden Evening Prayer* and have reflections on Martin Luther's Small Catechism.

Pastor Brian on Leave, May 15 to August 7

At the church's annual meeting in January, the congregation approved a sabbatical leave for Pastor Brian Hooper. The purpose of a sabbatical is for personal and spiritual growth, knowledge and skill development, renewal, revitalization, and enrichment. Pastor Brian's sabbatical will include



time for travel, education, and listening, as he explores a deeper sense of connectedness with God and creation. Various activities include studying Celtic spirituality, exploring new ideas for outdoor worship, focusing on the power of listening, further development of coaching skills, prayer, reading, and more. Pastor Brian will be on sabbatical leave from May 15 through August 7 (12 weeks). During this time, pastoral needs of the congregation will be covered by a variety of rostered ministers and lay leaders. Council Minutes - January 7

Present: Denise Sanders, Lorin Schuchardt, John Muroni. Sandy Wesolowski, Kristy Knipple, Kipp Zimmermann, Eric Sanders, Jane Miller, Keri Whitmore, Pastor Brian Hooper, Shelly Rosenstock, Alex Dollar, Carol Jackett The meeting was called to order by Denise Sanders at 6:30 pm., Carol shared a devotion

December Meeting Minutes Review: Reviewed and approved as amended. **Financial Reports:** Jane reported that the 2024 General donations of \$242,593 were 99.4% of what was budgeted and the 2024 Building donations of \$17,159 were 85.8% of the budgeted amount. John reported that the Old National CD matured on 12/27/24. John suggested looking into another CD, probably for something less than the amount of the maturing CD and maybe a separate CD for the mission endowment fund. John will be ending his time on the Council after 9 years of service. The Council thanked John for his years of service, his many contributions and sharing his expertise with the Council. A motion was made and seconded to approve the financial reports.

<u>Pastor Brian's Report:</u> A community prayer service will be held on January 19, 2025. A Neuroscience Workshop is planned for after the service on Sunday, February 16, 2025. Confirmation classes are being held. Several Pastoral visits were made in the community. SSM will be celebrating its 60th anniversary in 2025. Pastor Brian will be asking for feedback on how the church has been and continues to be part of your life.

<u>Current Action Items:</u> <u>Sabbatical Policy</u> – The Sabbatical Policy was reviewed and approved and is ready to be presented at the 2025 Annual Meeting. <u>Laptop</u> – A laptop was purchased and will be used primarily for bible study. <u>Electrical work</u> – to eliminate electrical cords running across the aisle some electrical work needs to be scheduled. This work is estimated to cost \$800. The Council approved this activity. What to do with the old sound system equipment needs to be decided.

Annual Meeting – Denise will send the final agenda for the annual meeting scheduled for January 26, 2025. The agenda so far will include the following: Election of a new Treasurer, Presentation of the Sabbatical Leave for approval, Sabbatical Leave proposal for Pastor Brian, RIC presentation and voting to approve becoming a RIC Church. (Note: Both the Sabbatical Leave for Pastor Brian and becoming a RIC congregation will be voted on by paper ballot.)

Council Minutes Continued

New Business:

The heat in Bonnie's office is not working. Total Mechanical has been contacted to provide an estimate to replace a valve in the office which will cost around \$1000.A motion was made and approved for the work and expense. Pastor Brian's Sabbatical Request.: 12 weeks between May 15 and August 7, 2025. Will require covering 2 services every week when gone. Costs and backup resources need to be finalized. A motion was made and approved to present the Sabbatical Leave request at the annual meeting on January 26th. Budget Review and Discussion: Eric presented the final budget information for 2024 and projected budget for 2025. The budget information was approved as submitted for presentation at the annual meeting. Eric will put together summary slides. Prior to the annual meeting there will be a budget review after the Sunday service on January 19th. That will provide the congregation with an opportunity to ask questions and give input before the annual meeting on January 26.

Committee Reports:

Music and Worship – We are starting to prepare for Easter services. Christian Education - the Sunday School children presented a very good Christmas concert. Evangelism - nothing to report Fellowship – in the early planning stages for a spring rummage sale. A date will be selected, and planning will begin. Stewardship – The pledges have been completed. If anyone has not yet made a pledge there is still an opportunity to do so. Finance – Budget summary for 2024 and proposed budget numbers for 2025 are ready for presentation at the annual meeting. John Muroni will be leaving the Council after 9 years of service as Treasurer. A replacement will be elected at the annual meeting. Youth and Family – Pajama Day was well attended, and everyone had a great time. There is an overnight event planned for February at Lutherdale that the Dollar family will be chaperoning. If interested talk to Alex for more information. Human Concerns – Food donations for February will benefit the Bay View Community Center. There has been great response and support for all activities during 2024.

<u>Adjournment and Closing Prayer</u> Pastor Brian led in a closing prayer, the meeting was adjourned at 7:55 pm. Next Council Meeting is Saturday, February 8, 2025, during the Council Retreat.
