### **Pastor's Page**



Dear SSM Faith Community,

The month of April this year is somewhat of a liturgical transition month. We are travelling through the wilderness of Lent, but signs of spring and Easter are on the horizon.

As we continue through Lent we move further into the deep of the journey to the cross, hearing the stories that speak of Jesus' power and glory. We remember how he went about healing the sick, feeding the hungry, and telling the people of the kingdom of God that was always closer.

During this month, midweek worship takes place on Wednesday evenings at 6:30pm, and we share some reflections on Martin Luther's Small Catechism.

When the season of Lent ends, we remember Jesus triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday weekend. We then enter the great Three Days (Triduum) which are the very heart of our community. Though they spread over three days, they are one liturgy in three parts. Think of them as your yearly spiritual retreat.

On Maundy Thursday, we remember Jesus' mandate to humbly serve our neighbors and the whole world. In a meal, we remember his sacrifice given for us. This year we will worship with our neighbors at Greendale Community Church. Worship will be at 6pm. The service will give a nod to the Passover Haggadah, but is NOT a Haggadah. There will be a tasting of the Passover foods...Matzoh, charosets, horseradish, and lamb

There will be a sign-up at SSM to help to know how many people will attend. A free will offering will be taken to help offset the cost of the meal. Most likely around \$8-\$10. The meal is a full meal that consists of a soup course, a salad course, a hot meat course, and dessert. We will need some volunteers to help in meal preparation and a volunteer sign up will be posted. The entire evening will be approximately two hours.

On Good Friday we meditate on Jesus' passion and death, we pray for everybody and everything, and we adore the cross that paradoxically gives life. There will be a Cross walk that starts at 2pm at St. Thomas of Canterbury and an ecumenical service at St. Alphonsus at 3pm. A Tenebrae service will be at 6:30pm at SSM.

And then Saturday, the Great Vigil of Easter at 5pm: There will be fire; word and silence; water, bread and wine; spring flowers and organ. This worship is both a celebration and a renewal of faith! Our service begins outside, around a new fire, a symbol that announces the new creation in Christ's death and resurrection. We carry a large candle into the darkened church, even as a pillar of fire led the Israelites to freedom.

On Easter, we bask in the joy of Jesus resurrection. Easter sunrise service is at 7am in the Prayer Garden and 9:30am in the church sanctuary. And you can enjoy Easter breakfast at 8:15am.

The congregation welcomes the public to this recital presented by David Jonies, Director of Music and Organist at Holy Name Cathedral in Chicago.

A native of Germany, he holds Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from the Hochschule für Musik in Würzburg and the Performer's Certificate from the Royal Academy of Music in London. His teachers have included James O'Donnell, David Titterington, Günther Kaunzinger, and Gerhard Weinberger.

Described as a "gem" (The American Organist) and an "impeccable" performer (Bonner Generalanzeiger), David enjoys an excellent reputation among his colleagues as a concert organist and church musician. Known for his wide range of repertoire, David was awarded the 1st prize at the 1999 Landau International Organ Competition.

International concert appearances include Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris, Westminster Abbey and the London Handel Festival in the U. K., the Pusan Bach Festival in South Korea, the Cathedral at Budejovice in the Czech Republic, the Bluval Music Festival and the Cathedrals of Bamberg, Mainz, Passau and Trier in Germany.

In the United States, he has performed at Chicago's Orchestra Hall with the Civic Orchestra of Chicago, at Marcus Center with the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, at the Cathedrals of Seattle, Helena, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Sioux City, and Houston, and recitals and workshops for American Guild of Organists.

"I Love to tell the Story; Will be my theme in glory; To tell the old old story; of Jesus and His love."

Perhaps you noticed that the primary text of the Bible is the compilation of the stories of God's interaction with the world. In the Biblical sense, the very definition of history is the stories of God's interaction with the world. Historical fact (time, place, sequence) had little importance. What really mattered to the writers was that we see God as an interested party in



the affairs of the people that he loves. Primary for the church is the central event of the incarnation of Christ – the in-personal interaction of God in the life of the world.

We just celebrated Christmas and heard again the stories of the visitation of Gabriel to Mary; the journey to Bethlehem; the angels' announcement to the shepherds. We heard the story of Joseph's confusion and Gabriel's announcement to Joseph that God was at work in Mary's pregnancy. We heard the story of the Magi's' visitation as the representatives of the gentile world before God. All of these stories now lead us into the greatest story – the Passion and Resurrection of Jesus for the life of the world.

These stories have drawn millions to faith and relationship with God and with each other. Now it is our turn – to tell the story that is. To tell the stories of how God has come to each of us through those who interacted with our lives. We are stewards of these stories – The Gospel – of Jesus and his love. What you have to offer is the story of how that love has carried you through life, especially how St. Stephen the Martyr has been of help and support throughout the events of your life. Stewardship is about the use of your life and experience of the love of God to make a difference in the lives of those around you. Won't you share that gift with the world?





The meeting was called to order by Denise Sanders at 11:05 am. January Council Minutes. After reviewing the January minutes a motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as written.
